As you are fully aware, due to the current sanitary conditions some safety measures need to be observed in order to allow for presential classes. Please respect the following rules during the Fach-praktikum laboratory sessions. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Please note that the Covid Certificate is mandatory for Laboratory Courses at ETH!

1. Students in high-risk group

Students in high-risk groups must inform the supervisor (akarapetyan@control.ee.ethz.ch) in advance to get information on the safety precautions taken at the lab. They should then contact a general practitioner or medical specialist to determine if participating in the practical laboratory course is possible based on the measures listed in the protection concept (https://bit.ly/ 3EFpLyf).

2. Windows open

The windows in the laboratory room should remain open as much as possible to ventilate the room. They should be constantly open, if the temperature allows for it. The strict minimum requirement is that they remain open for 5-10 minutes every hour.

3. Minimum distance

People in the room should always maintain a minimum distance of 1.5m whenever possible.

4. Face masks

People in the room should wear face masks at all times.

5. Illness

In case of illness (flu, fever, cough, etc.) you are not allowed to attend the laboratory session. We offer plenty of dates and are flexible, just send us an e-mail and we will make sure you can have another session as soon as possible.

6. Sanitizing

At the end of every session, each person is required to take sanitizing wipes (they are available in the laboratory room) and clean the surfaces that she/he has been in contact with. This includes, in particular, keyboard, mouse, desk, laboratory equipment.

7. ETH rules

All general ETH safety rules that were not mentioned above have to be respected.
